Negotiation-

The reaching of agreement through discussion and compromise.

Mediation-

Is a negotiation process in which two or more people involved in conflict meet in order to work out a solution to a specific issue with the help of a neutral person (a mediator).

Arbitration-

The process of resolving disputes between people or groups by referring them to a third party, either agreed on by them or provided by law, who makes a judgment.

Adjudication-

A judicial decision, sentence, or decree.

Sample Scenario

Mrs. Garcia (A) has recently moved with her family into an apartment building that has a laundry room for all tenants to share. The laundry room has three washers and three dryers for the ten apartments in the building, which has previously been adequate. Since Mrs. Garcia (A) moved in, the tenants (B) often have to wait several hours before they can use the laundry because Mrs. Garcia (A) has all machines occupied. They (B) suspect that she is doing the laundry of her relatives as well as her own. They (B) are no longer friendly to Mrs. Garcia (A) and sometimes make rude racial comments or empty her wash on the floor when she is not there.
