## 4-H Mini - Camp Horse Barn Information



- \*\* These guidelines pertain to Horse Project and Horseless Horse Project members:
- 1.) Each 4-H member is responsible for the care of his/her horse. This includes feeding, watering and stall set-up and cleaning. Each 4-H member must completely clean out his/her stall (if used) at the conclusion of the Mini Camp. Double check to make sure you do not leave anything behind.
- 2.) Parents are **required** to stay during the Mini Camp. Your help is much appreciated.
- 3.) All 4-H members must show proof of having an SEI approved helmet and must wear it whenever mounted.
- 4.) All 4-H members must show proof of a negative Coggins on their horse(s). If horse is from out of state health records are required too.
- 5.) No sitting on stall walls or swinging on gates in the barn.
- 6.) Do not mount your horse in the stall or in the barn. Please lead your horse to and from all mounted activities.
- 7.) No smoking or alcoholic beverages on the fairgrounds.
- 8.) No grooming in the aisles. Please groom inside the stall.
- 9.) All riders must use a bridle ... no riding with a halter.
- 10.) Hard-toed shoes with a heel and long pants must be worn by all 4-H members whenever near a horse. This includes when grooming and cleaning stalls, as well as when riding or leading your horse.
- 11.) Sick horses will be sent home.
- 12.) Only the youth member who is responsible for the horse and the owner/buddy may be in the stall at any time. No additional friends, members, or guest may be in the stall with horses.
- 13.) Additional guidelines may be posted in the barns during Mini Camp. It is each 4-H member's responsibility to make sure they are followed.
