#### **Elementary, Grades 3-5: (100 word limit)**

Describe one or two responsibilities you accepted in 4-H this year. Tell what you learned about the importance of being responsible.

#### **Junior, Grades 6-8: (150 word limit)**

Describe a 4-H experience during a meeting or service event that was important to you. What have you gained from that experience?

#### **Senior, Grades 9-13: (250 words)**

How has 4-H impacted your life?
